 - a. Q&A / Discussion
 - The estimates that we see now are half of what we had anticipated.
 No specific feedback from fire departments, but we didn't ask them to do a detailed inventory in the initial ask, only estimates.
 - ii. If you were to petition or get approval for a collection program, would you have to go through another EIS?
 - 1. Short answer is that we'd have to do a supplemental EIS and an additional analysis.
 - iii. Is there a monitoring program attached to this (e.g., ground water)?
 - 1. Unsure specifically, but TTP is monitoring and Washington is engaged in litigation about manufacturing of AFFF.
 - iv. Can we still use test boxes for the foam?
 - 1. The FAA will allow airports to use those boxes, but they'll have to be modified to some degree. F3 foam is a little more viscous compared to AFFF, so some changes need to be made to allow for the mixture to flow through correctly.
